The Zambezi River, one of the largest in Africa, feeds the magnificent Victoria Falls waterfall. The nearby town of Livingstone, is named after the famous Scottish-born missionary David Livingstone, who explored the region in 1851.

In addition to tourism, Zambia's economy benefits from its copper mines. The mineral is widely exported around the world.



Zambia has a mild climate. January is the peak of the rainy season, and by June the weather is dry. September and October are the hottest, driest months.

Most Zambians live in urban areas such as the capital Lusaka, leaving the rural regions a sparsely populated haven for wildlife. Elephants, lions and herds of antelope and zebra are popular sights in its 20 National Parks.
